# CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. **Disclaimer of Liability.** In this clause the term Exhibitor shall include persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the show Committee and the owner of any animal, plant machinery or other thing involved in any such competition or display or otherwise exhibited on the showground. Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Committee, its servants or agents, the committee will not be responsible for death, injury, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his or her servant or agent or to any animal, article, plant, machinery or thing of whatever nature brought on to the showground by the said exhibitor from whatever cause death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises.

(Save as aforesaid) the exhibitor shall indemnify the committee against all claims, damages and expenses whatsoever in any way arising out of the presence of the exhibitor, his servants, agents, exhibits, vehicles or equipment on the showground and shall assume full responsibility therefore. Acceptance of the foregoing provisions shall be a condition of entry.

Exhibitors are advised to insure against fire and other appropriate risk not only as regards their own property but also against any third party claim.

Entry to the show is by ticket and every ticket is issued on the understanding that the person to whom the ticket is issued is on the showground entirely at their own risk and must have deemed to take the Showground and thereon as he finds it. He shall not have, or make, any claim for injury or damage against Market Bosworth Agricultural, Horticultural and Equestrian society or its respective Officers, Agents or workmen; however such injury or damage shall be caused.

## 2. Entries

- ◆ All entries must be made on the Official Entry forms together with the full entry fees.
- ◆ Cheques should be crossed and made payable to: Market Bosworth Show
- ◆ No telephone or late entries will be accepted
- ◆ No entry money will be refunded except under British Showjumping Rules.
- ◆ The Council of the Society reserves the right to refuse entry.
- ◆ **Reduced entry fees for Members relate to fully paid up Members of the Market Bosworth Agricultural, Horticultural and Equestrian Society.**
- ◆ Entries in Showjumping classes confined to horses/ponies registered with the British Showjumping and ridden by members in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79.

## 3. Conditions of Entry

- ◆ The numbers that each Competitor receives from the Secretary must be worn in a conspicuous place. Numbers will not be issued until all fees are paid and duplicate numbers will not be issued at any time.
- ◆ No substitution of Exhibits is permitted, except in the show jumping classes when the British Showjumping rules apply.
- ◆ No person who shall have been shown to the satisfaction of the Council to have been excluded from exhibiting for prizes at shows, sales or exhibitions or any other Breed or Agricultural society, Association or Club and no person who is under exclusion or suspension from any Breed Society or Agricultural Society, Association or club shall be allowed to exhibit at this or any other Show or society.
- ◆ Competitors may be disqualified from any Class for not observing the Rules or causing unnecessary delay to the continuity of the Show.

## 4. Judging

- ◆ The Council reserves the right to vary or add to the panel of Judges as it is deemed necessary.
- ◆ A Judge may withhold any prize if, in his opinion, an exhibit is of insufficient merit.
- ◆ If there are not more than three entries in a Class it is left to the discretion of the Judge and Stewards to withhold the First and other prizes should the quality of entries not justify a prize.
- ◆ Where there is doubt regarding the age of a Competitor, they must be prepared to produce a Birth Certificate.

- ◆ Where the height of a horse or pony is specified in any Class, the Steward, Official or Judge may require such an animal to be measured by the Society's Veterinary Surgeon unless the animal has an official measurement certificate issued by the Joint Measurement Board. 1/2" will be allowed for normal shoes.
  - ◆ No person may deliberately and knowingly enter and show an equine under a Judge who is known to have bred, sold or produced that animal or have a pecuniary interest.
  - ◆ The judges decision is final
5. **Objections** must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of £100 and handed to the Secretary within thirty minutes of the finish of the event concerned.
6. **Prize-winners**
- ◆ All cups and trophies to be held for one year, unless otherwise stated and remain the property of the Society. Cups/Trophies to be collected on Show Day by the winners from the Secretary's Office. A receipt must be given and the Cup/Trophy returned to the Secretary on or before 12<sup>th</sup> June of the following year. It is the responsibility of all Cup and Trophy winners to ensure that these are returned promptly. Cups & Trophies must be insured whilst in the winner's possession and whilst in transit to the Society. A deposit of £50 is required to remove the cup from the Showground.
  - ◆ **Prize money will be paid out at the Treasurer's Caravan. Prize money not collected on the show Day will be forfeited and donated to the Charity suggested by the Society.**
  - ◆ Prize money will only be paid to the Winner if there are less than 6 entries in any showing class (except for Heavy Horse classes).
7. **Health & Safety**
- ◆ Headgear meeting current British Safety Standards must be worn by riders at all times and properly fastened. Skull cap covers must be blue or navy.
  - ◆ All dogs must be kept on a lead and under proper control at all times
  - ◆ No animal suffering from a contagious disease may be brought onto the Showground.
  - ◆ In the event of an Honorary Veterinary Surgeon advising the removal of any animal from the showground his decision shall be immediately complied with.
8. **Parking**
- ◆ Exhibitors Vehicles. All vehicles must be parked at the places provided or as directed by the parking attendants.
  - ◆ Persons are admitted entry to the show car parks at their own risk and vehicles and their accessories and contents are admitted to and left in the car parks at the owner's risk, and while every endeavour is taken to ensure the safety thereof, the committee will not (save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the committee, its servants, or agents) be responsible for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise) loss of damage to property and any other loss, damage, costs and expenses howsoever caused.

# SHOWING

## **ALL EXHIBITS ENTERED INTO THE MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND CLASSES MUST BE REGISTERED WITH THEIR APPROPRIATE BREED SOCIETY**

### **PONIES (UK) SUMMER SHOWING CHAMPIONSHIPS:**

This show is a qualifier for 2010 Ponies (UK) Summer Championships. The 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> in each qualifying class will qualify. **NO** qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, placings will be confirmed by results sent in by the show secretary. Qualification is open to members and non members of P(UK).

### **NPS MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND QUALIFYING ROUNDS:**

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 4-6<sup>th</sup> August 2010.

The highest placed pony owned by an NPS member in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line which is owned by an NPS member and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Judges and/or stewards are requested to check membership cards prior to presenting the qualifying rosettes and cards. NPS Adult/Standard members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the final.

NPS/Rosettes Direct Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show.

### **NPS SILVER MEDAL ROSETTE CHAMPIONSHIPS**

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve. Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 4-6<sup>th</sup> August 2010.

### **VETERANS**

The Veteran Horse Showing Ltd Olympia Area Qualifiers are open to both Members & Non Members of the VHS. **ONLY** Veteran Horse Society Members are eligible to compete in the Regional Championship. Qualification cards will **ONLY** be given to the first 3 Members with their VHS Membership/Horse Registration cards/Covering Letter from Show Office. Regional winners will go on to compete at the Veteran Horse Showing Ltd Championship Supreme Final at the London International Horse Show at Olympia in December.

### **EQUIFEST**

This show is a qualifier for the 2010 Equifest Showing Show held at the East of England Showground on the 19-22 August 2010. The two highest placed in Classes 17-20, 27, 43-45, 47, 54-57 plus Champion & Reserve Welsh A, B, C/D, Shetland, Small/Large breeds will qualify.

### **AMATEUR SHOWING SOCIETY**

This show is a qualifier for the 2010 Amateur Showing Society Summer Championships. 1<sup>st</sup> -3<sup>rd</sup> in Classes 24-27, 41-48, 50-51, 58, 73-76, 89-97. Competitors have 28 days to become a member to retain the qualification

### RING 2 Commencing : 08:30

#### HUNTERS

Sports Horse Breeding (GB) requires all exhibits in classes 11-23 to be registered with the Society. The Hunter classes will be judged in accordance with SHB(GB) rules 2010.

Classes 17-21 and 23 are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show and only horses registered on the current Show Hunter Register are eligible to compete. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be members of the Society. The two highest placed horses in each class (Classes 17-21) will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second in its class will qualify. In the Open Working Hunter (Class 23) the 3 highest placed horses will qualify unless they have already done so. No horse lower than 3<sup>rd</sup> will qualify. Horses entering class 16 and 22 must be registered on the SHB (GB) Identity register.

The National Hunter Supreme Championship Show (NHSCS) qualifying classes. Classes 17-20 are qualifying events for this year's NHSCS. The 3 highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter at NHSCS. No horse lower than 3<sup>rd</sup> will qualify. All regulations applicable to the HOYS qualifiers will also apply to NHSCS qualifiers.
